The New Audio Download Service

Our new audio download service gives anyone with a PC and an internet connection access to most of the audio publications we record in our studios. No more waiting, no more wallets!

What equipment do I need to access this service?

You will need a PC or other device that can access the web, along with an internet connection - a broadband connection is recommended. You can listen to the material on your PC using most software media players such as WinAmp or Windows Media player.

What publications can I access?

When first launched in June 2007, fifty of our most

popular audio publications were available via download. The aim is to quickly increase the number available so that all audio publications can be obtained via this service as soon as possible. Please contact Customer Services to check availability. A subscription to this service provides access to all available material - there are no restrictions on what you can download.

Can I download publications and listen to them later or transfer them to another device?

Subscribers can listen to publications online or download publications for later listening. The audio is presented in MP3 format and can be transferred to

any MP3 capable device. You can even create your own audio CDs!

Are Podcasts available?

Each publication has its own podcast, enabling you to automatically download the latest editions of your favourite publications as soon as they become available.

How long does it take to download a publication?

Each publication is presented in two or four 45 minute parts - equivalent to tape 'sides'. Using a 2MB Broadband connection, each part will download in about 1 minute. It is also possible to download individual articles - the filesizes of which are available on the site.

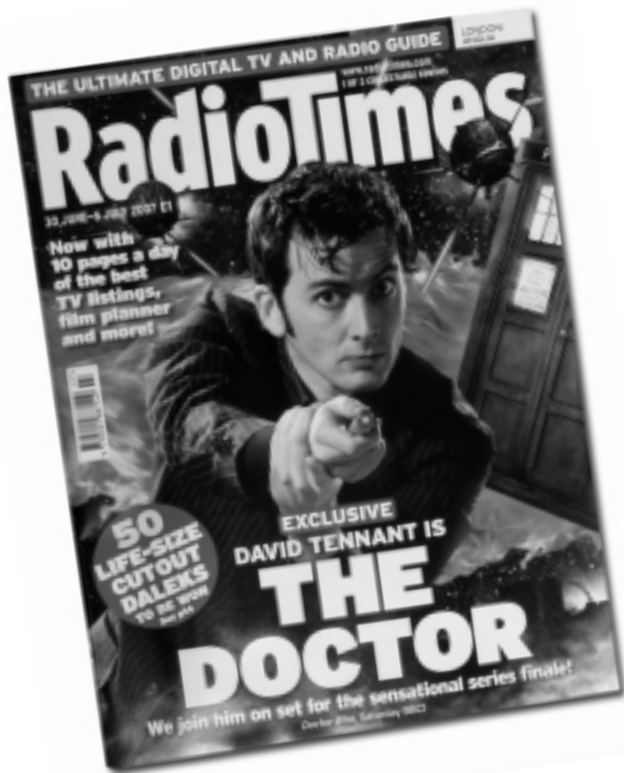

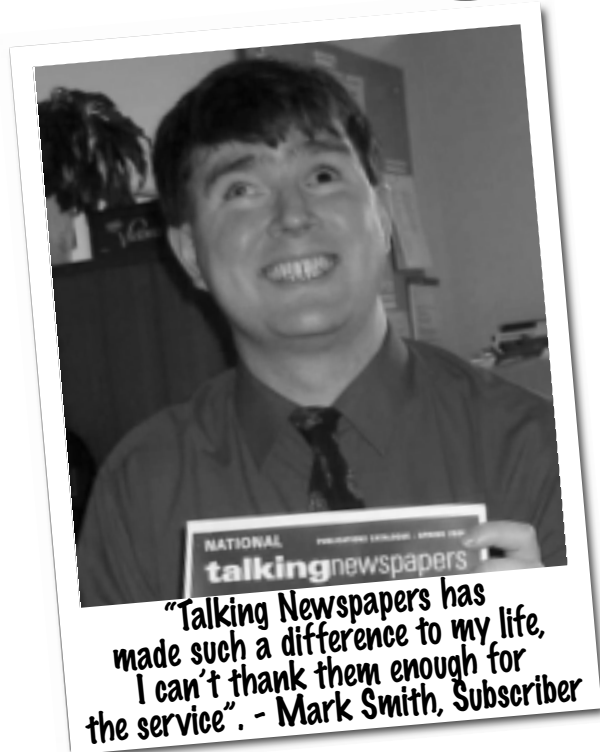

The Challenge

Imagine not being able to pick up a newspaper to read the latest news, enjoy your favourite magazines, or join in a conversation with friends and colleagues because you can't read about the issues they are all talking about.

This is the situation faced by around two million people in the UK who are denied the opportunity to read because of a sight problem or other reading disability. Our service helps blind and print disabled people achieve a level of independence and choice that most sighted people take for granted.

History

National Talking Newspapers & Magazines started in 1983 as part of the Talking Newspaper Association of the UK (TNAUK), the association of local talking newspapers - itself set up in 1974. In 2005, responsibility for local Talking Newspapers was taken on by a new organisation, the Talking News

Federation (TNF). This left National Talking Newspapers & Magazines to concentrate on it's primary purpose of serving as national newsagent for blind and partially sighted people and others for whom print is not an accessible medium.

National Recording Centre

Producing more than 230 titles in audio format and another 80 or so as digital E-Text involves around 40 paid staff and a small army of over 200 volunteers working at the National Recording Centre in Heathfield, East Sussex.

Audio

Audio publications are recorded in our eight studios. Each recording session involving a studio manager and a couple of volunteer readers. Our studios are digitally equipped, so recordings can easily be output in a variety of formats including tape, audio CD, DAISY CD and MP3 download.

Our production department duplicates

and despatches more than a million tapes each year and more than one thousand CDs each week. Each tape title is despatched in a returnable wallet, so subscribers can return their tapes for reuse.

E-text

Our E-Text titles include all of the text content of a publication, delivered via email, download or CD-ROM. Subscribers can access the content using their PCs and screenreader software. We rely on the publishers to provide

the original text or artwork files, and many of the newspapers we produce in E-Text format are made available to subscribers before the paper-based copy is available in the shops!

Funding

We receive no government funding and subscription income amounts to less than half the sum we need to cover our costs. If you would like to contribute to maintaining this unique and invaluable service, turn to page 26 to learn how you can help.

Subscriber Profile: Alan Pickering



Number of Years a subscriber: 24 – since the beginning!

NTN&M: Can you give us a little bit of an idea about your background and about your sight?

ALAN: I was born with an inherited sight condition called retinitis pigmentosa. I could read newspapers until about the age of 30. As I lost the ability to read myself, that shortfall was made good by the people around me who helped me read, but Talking Newspapers gave me the independence to read what I wanted when I wanted.

Listening to my newspapers makes washing up and gardening chores more tolerable. I travel a lot and I listen to my newspapers whether I'm on the train, the bus or the plane.

NTN&M: What publications do you subscribe to and why?

ALAN: Because my job involves personal finance I take the Economist, the Investors Chronicle, Financial Times, so not only are those tapes enjoyable I like to think they make me employable as well, but I then take some titles that are purely for pleasure. I like the outdoor life so I read Farmers Weekly. I like Horse Racing so I take Sporting Life Weekender. It was through taking Sporting Life Weekender that I fulfilled a dream in actually owning a race horse. In one of the editions, they highlighted somebody who was setting up a syndicate so you could own a bit of a horse for not too much money. Having had my appetite whetted by being part of a syndicate I then progressed to owning my own horse, and that really has given me a wonderful added dimension to my life; an added dimension that I probably wouldn't have had, had it not been for Talking Newspapers.

The UltraCane - under £30 a month!

What is the UltraCane?

It is a new type of mobility aid. Its design is based on a white cane, but there is a crucial difference that is helping vision impaired people throughout the world to enjoy a new sense of confidence and independence.

It works by sending out ultrasonic waves which bounce back off objects in front of it and to head height. It then feeds back information about the environment to buttons in the handle which vibrate. This means that the person can build up a mental map of the surroundings, without interference with obstacle sense or other important auditory information.

Who can benefit?

The people who are really benefiting from the UltraCane are individuals who are relatively mobile, with few problems of movement beyond the loss of their sight. They tend to have fairly good white cane skills already, or be used to using their obstacle sense. They tend to learn how to use the UltraCane after very few sessions, and they walk away feeling much more confident and safe as a result.

As you can tell, I could go on at great length because I'd really like you to know about the fantastic feedback from the vision impaired community. I hope, however, that you might find out for yourself.

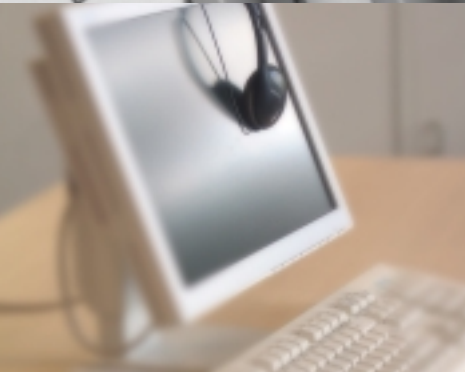
