

The Challenge

Around two million people in the UK are unable to access the printed word because of a sight problem or other reading disability. Imagine not being able to pick up a newspaper and learn about the latest news, enjoy your favourite magazine, or

join in a conversation with friends and colleagues because you can't read about the issues they are all talking about.

Our service helps blind and print disabled people gain access to information that would otherwise be denied to them, enabling them to achieve a level of independence and choice that most sighted people take for granted.

Our Publications

Our audio publications are produced digitally in our eight on-site studios. Each recording session involves a studio manager and a couple of volunteer readers. The audio is then output in a variety of formats including tape, audio CD, DAISY CD

and MP3 download. Tape titles are sent in returnable wallets so subscribers can return their tapes for re-use. About 80 different publications are available as digital full-text, delivered by email, web download or CD-ROM. Subscribers access the content using their PCs and screenreader software. Many of the newspapers we produce

as digital full-text are available before the hardcopy is available in the shops!

Established in 1983, National Talking Newspapers and Magazines now produces over 200 newspaper and magazine titles in a variety of audio and digital full-text formats at our National Recording Centre in Heathfield, East Sussex. More than 200 volunteers and around 40 staff are involved in maintaining the service.




Publications are downloaded in MP3 format and can be played on most digital media players.

Publications are delivered postage free to the visually impaired and subscribers can even change their choices during the course of their subscription. The National Talking Newspaper and Magazine service can be delivered in the five following formats.



audio CD Many publications are available on audio CD, offering better navigation, improved playback quality and you get to keep them! Audio CD titles will play on any standard domestic CD player. They can also be played using certain RNIB talking book machines as well as DVD players and PC CD drives.



audio tape Recorded and produced in our National Recording Centre, the tapes are playable on any standard cassette player or music centre. Individual copies are sent FREEPOST in PVC postal wallets which have reversible address labels for FREEPOST return.

audio download Most of the audio publications recorded in our studios are available via a web download. The audio can be played online or downloaded for later listening on a portable MP3 player such as a Milestone, iPod or Book Courier. Publications can be downloaded in two or four 45 minute parts, or article by article.

digital full-text Many publications are available in digital full-text format, which is read by subscribers' own screen reading software. The texts can be delivered by email, web download or on a weekly CD-ROM. Most daily newspapers are delivered on the day of publication and the full text is available.

DAISY Our range of DAISY compilations delivers both choice and value. They are presented on CD-ROM and can be played on DAISY Talking Book and Magazine players. Offering enhanced navigation, variable play speed/pitch and bookmarking, DAISY is a great way to access your favourite publications.
